I would like to take this opportunity to explain my discipline management plan to you. It is important to me to be fair and consistant with your child's discipline. Holly Springs is a Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) school, so we want to focus on the positive things your child is doing. My classroom discipline plan lends itself to teaching children how to make good choices and use their self control. Each child will have a job as a classroom helper, so they feel a part of the classroom and learn responsibility. There are many positive programs set up in my room to encourage the children to make good choices. The following is a list of positive rewards that your child can earn.


Rewards:


- -Positive praise
- -Happy hotes
- -Smelly stickers and regualr stickers
- -Earning privileges
- -<u>Tickets</u> If a student shows SPOT behavior then they will receive a ticket & I will have a drawing for children to go to the prize box on Friday.
- -<u>Spots</u>- When the whole class receives a compliment from another teacher or administrator, they will earn a "Teamwork" ticket. We will keep track of the total in the hallway by our door.

It is your child's responsibility to tell you what color they were on. However, if your child is on red, I will send home a SPOT check sheet with highlighted rules that your child had difficulty following that day. Please sigh it so I know you are aware of what happened. I will talk with your child about what happened as well. We'll discuss why it was wrong and how he/she can fix it. I believe that it is very important for children to learn that they are responsible for their own behavior and choices. I would like the occurrence to be viewed as a learning experience. You might want to also talk with your child about making better choices for the next day. Your child will have the opportunity to move back to green if they have moved SPOT to yellow or red. Hopefully your child will come home on green every day, but we all make mistakes. It's what we learn from them that's important ©
